Please note: To date we have not received any updates from the Department on how our pupils will return to school ie as usual or in a phased manner. This school calendar assumes that the school year will be as normal. As such, it is subject to change in line with any decisions made by the Department of Education and Skills.

Home schooling: As we continue with our home-schooling, I wish to acknowledge the work being done by you the parents in supporting our staff in the education of your children from a distance. This is a situation that was foisted upon us very suddenly in March. As a school we have invested in equipment, have updated our policies and have upskilled ourselves to enable us to provide this schooling from a distance. It is not easy to keep up the momentum, but our experience is that as we go on, staff and pupils are being more creative in finding ways to communicate with each other. So well done to everyone. We are all aware that we may revert to home-schooling at some stage in the next school year, if the schools are closed again. So, as a staff, we will continue to develop our skills in this area. We have another month until the summer holidays and we encourage you to keep up the momentum.

Acceptable Use Policy and Remote Learning Charter: we have updated our Acceptable use Policy and our Remote Learning Charter. We will send you out the updated versions in the coming days and request that you read the documents carefully. Class teachers will talk through the documents with the children. Our aim is to ensure safe practices in the use of technology. In the junior end of the school we will be setting up accounts for the children on the school platform Microsoft Teams as a contingency if required to ensure continuity of learning next year.

All parents will need to read the Acceptable Usage policy and Remote Learning Charter and sign giving consent via Aladdin Connect forms by Friday, June 12th.

Further information will be sent to all classes, separate from this newsletter.

6th class graduation: As it is not possible to hold a graduation in the school, Thomas, 6th class teacher, is organising a virtual graduation which will be pre-recorded and will be broadcast on Wednesday June 24th. Thomas will provide more information on this in the coming weeks. As usual, each child will be presented with a graduation hoodie and a Graduation medal. School return: We hope to be able to invite all 6th class pupils to the school in August, which will allow the pupils to meet with each other briefly before the begin their second-level schooling. We know that this is something that the pupils would love themselves and we will facilitate it if possible.

6th class school leavers: We have 29 pupils in 6th class this year: 29 pupils who will make the transition to secondary school in September. It is a great shame that they have not had the opportunity to complete their school year and the many exciting projects that they were working on. This final term in 6th class is a

very special time and it is often the last time that this particular group will be together. With this in mind, every effort will be made to ensure that we bring them together in August. Of the 29 pupils leaving, 18 of these represent 17 families that are finishing up in our school. I wish to thank all of these pupils and their families for their great contribution to the school and for the great support given to the school by parents as these children have journeyed through. I am reminded of the old saying: it takes a village to rear a child: in the same way all who are involved in a child's schooling play a very important role. I thank the teachers that have taught this class en route ie, (from Junior Infants to Sixth class: Angela, Noreen, Elaine/Naos, Angela, Naos, Mary, Aimee/Noreen, Thomas) and I thank all staff members who have supported and encouraged them at all times. Our school curriculum is geared to providing a balanced education to our pupils, and to equipping children with a sense of self-belief and citizenship that will be further developed as they

grow and mature. I am happy that these children are well-equipped to progress to second-level school and I wish them success.

Active Week: June 15-19: As always, we encourage our pupils to be active, and thankfully we have had great weather in recent weeks. During active week, teachers will guide your children on activities that they will enjoy. It is so important that our children have fun in the outdoors.

School Book collection: When the school was closed in March, we sent home a number of books that are the property of the school Book Rental scheme. These books are the Reading Zone Readers, and the History, Geography and Science readers. Fifth class pupils also brought home a class novel 'The Wildflower Girl' which is the property of the library. We now wish to collect up these books and we trust that they will be returned to us in good condition. Children will not be assigned work from these books for the remainder of the school year.

On Thursday June 11 and Friday June 12, we will have collection boxes set out on tables at the door of the school between the hours of 10am and 2pm. We ask that you return the books to the collection boxes. This will be a drop and go exercise. We look forward to having our books returned. If for some reason you cannot return books at this time, we ask that you return them to the school at the beginning of the next school year.


Not quite the same as our usual antics at the parade but still, a great effort by our School Community.


