MangaHigh Maths: MangaHigh is a game-based platform for primary and secondary school mathematics. During Maths week our 5th class pupils participated in this online competition against schools across the country. We had a number of winners in the competition for 5th class, Orlando, Mero, Olaf, Robert, Paddy, Ben, Ethan, Ian, and Sindu.

Junior Enterprise Program: This year 6th class will take part in the Junior Enterprise Program. This program promotes innovation and entrepreneurial spirit in young students. Sixth class will be creating their own unique product which we hope to sell to the general public. All profits made from the enterprise will be shared among the students in 6th class. Since 2010 over 50,000 students have created their own classroom businesses with JEP and a JEP survey indicated that teachers saw improved confidence, team

building, communications and independence in children who participated in the program.

Kildare Library Service: This service supports primary schools through the network of community libraries by facilitating block loans for teachers, class visits and lending class-sets. Reading opens a whole new world to the young child and developing the "reading habit" with regular visits to the library will help build the foundations for future learning.

FAI Schools Soccer tournament: Congratulations to our school soccer team who won the FAI 11-a-side schools soccer competition. Please see the report which maps out the entire jouney through the competition to the final.

FAI 11 a side

The FAI 11 a side soccer tournament is run in Kildare each year. This is the first year that Maynooth ETNS have entered the competition and what a year it has been for the boys teams.

The boys who represented the school were: from 6th, Felix, Efraim, Max, Saul, Eugene, Adrien, Tadgh, Nathan, Cristian, Ethan, Sam and Matthew, and from 5th class, Andrew, Ben, Dominas, Ethan, Ian, Jago, Martynas, Matthew, Merowech, Orlando, Paddy, Robert, Ronan and Shi Hing. The boys started with a very tough away match to Kildare Town ETNS. After playing into a strong wind we went in at half time 1-1 thanks to a Ben Lowings goal from a corner kick. The second half was dominated by Maynooth and further goals from Efraim Zinca and a wonderful team goal finished by Ethan Hennessy.

The second day out we played Ticknevin NS at home in Maynooth Town FC. This was a very strong performance by the boys as they ran out winning 8-3 with goals from Efraim Zinca (3), Ethan Connolly (2), Adrien Kells (1), Paddy Ryan (1) and Orlando Gale-Scourfield (1).

These two victories left us knowing a victory in our final game would qualify us for a semi final. The boys were fantastic again in beating Naas CNS away by 4 goals to 1. The goals coming from a penalty by Efraim Zinca and a goal each by Ronan Notin-Bairead, Cristian Rosca and Robert Taranu.

We were then left with a very tough job of trying to choose 18 players to represent the school in the semi final. The boys who made up the team for the semi-final were, Efraim, Adrien, Sam, Saul, Ethan Connolly, Matthew Hirsh, Cristian, Nathan, Felix, Tadgh, Matthew Canning, Ronan, Orlando, Ben, Paddy, Mero, Jago and Ethan Hennessy.

The boys were drawn against St. Patricks Newbridge in the semi-final. Every one of the 18 players played their part on the day with the boys winning on a score line of 2-0 thanks to two goals from our Captain Efraim Zinca. The team and management would like to thank all the supports who came to cheer the team on for the semi final.

This qualified us for schools first ever 11 a-side final against Ballymore Eustace on the 24th of October. The team and coaches travelled to the match along with children from 4th, 5th and 6th class who wanted to cheer on our team. This day showed great school community as the children supporting gave a great lift to the boys on the day when they needed it.

The team that started the final were: in goal Matthew Canning, in defence Cristian, Ben, Tadgh and Mero, in midfield Adrien, Paddy, Matthew Hirsh and Ethan Connolly, and up top Efraim and Ethan Hennessy. The boys had to show great resolve after the Ballymore team took a surprise lead against the run of the play as a long distance shot looped up and despairingly over Matthew who had no chance of stopping it. The team rallied and some great team

work lead to a corner kick which Ethan Hennessy delivered and Paddy Ryan smashed the ball to the net with a sweet left-footed half-volley. The whole team performed brilliantly in the first half playing into a strong wind, especially our 4 defenders.

This food will not provide the nutrition that children need and such treats should be included in lunches only on Fridays, and even then should be an addition to an otherwise healthy lunch.

<u>Nut Free school</u>: Our school is a nut-free school, as we have a number of children with nut allergies. We therefore request that no

nuts, or foods containing nuts are sent to school. Treats taken from a multipack are sometimes not individually labelled as containing nuts, whereas the outer package may state that the contents do contain nuts. In instances such as this, we reserve the right to not allow the treat to be eaten during school hours, but it will be returned to the child at the end of the school day.
