Maths Events: Maths Week 2019 proved to be such a hit with the children in our school that we decided to extend the celebrations to a fortnight! During the course of two weeks the children engaged in a range of practical activities which included maths trails, coding workshops, scavenger hunts and a range of online challenges. We welcomed quest speaker, Scientific Sue, who completed a forensic science workshop with  $4^{th}$  class, while  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$ class attended a talk and workshop named "Murderous Maths" in the Department of Mathematics at DIT Kevin Street. The puzzle competition generated huge excitement and we were delighted to see children from all classes participating each day. Special mention goes to our two parent winners, Neasa Hogan and Fiona Moran, who won prizes on the first day of the competition. A complete list of winners will be shared in our November newsletter.

5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> classes took part on the on-line Maths Game, "Manga High". 6<sup>th</sup> class won 5 gold medals and 5<sup>th</sup> class won 8 gold medals so well done to all the pupils that took part.

5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class also won 30<sup>th</sup> Ranking at all Ireland level. This is the highest ranking that we have achieved to date, so it's a cause for celebration. Well done.

**Bebras Challenge**: On November 11<sup>th</sup> classes 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> will travel to Maynooth University to take part in the Bebras Challenge. This is a maths problem-solving event and will challenge even our best maths wizards.

Junior Infants Settling In: Our 2 Junior Infant classes have been working very hard during their first term in school. We have learned many songs and nursery rhymes and are working on holding our pencils correctly. We are busy with Jollyphonics; learning to read and write. We have learned a number of phrases 'as Gaeilge' and are using these throughout our school day. For maths week we programmed the BeeBot robots to move around the map and we played a number of fun maths games. We were very excited to perform our Halloween poem at assembly on Friday.
