Green Schools Committee: The Green Schools committee has the following suggestions for ways in which we can reduce our use of plastic in the next school year:

- Stainless steel lunchboxes are a durable and long lasting alternative to plastic one and are worth the initial cost
- Beeswax food wraps are a reusable alternative to cling film. Paper food wraps are also a better option than cling film.

GAA training: 5th and 6th classes are availing of training provided by the GAA in an outdoor setting in the school grounds. Sincere thanks to for his work.

Safe Cycling course: 6th class are availing of the Safe Cycling course provided by KIldare County Council. This course teaches competency in cycling and taking care of a bicycle, and maintaining it in good working and safe order. It also teaches children the rules of the road and how to deal with different situations. Sixth class have thoroughly enjoyed this course.

New School building On May 4th, the school building was taken over by Educate Together and subsequently our Board of Management. We are moving into this building gradually. Our Senior Infant class has moved in, and their previous room has been configured into the 3 Special Education Teaching rooms in accordance with the school plans.
