This will be displayed in our school lobby area, with all art works created by our previous 6th class pupils. Marie School Principal thanked the pupils for their very positive contribution to the school and had words of advice as they move forward to their second-level schooling. ## **School Tours:**

This school year we organised in-school events for our classes rather than the usual school outings.

- Monday 28th June: The Archaeology Society of Ireland will run a Big Dig for classes 2nd to 6th. The children had a ball! And returned to the classroom happy and dirty!
- Tuesday 29th June:, Wollys Farm will visit the school for classes Junior Infants up to 1st, and

  these animals. There were goats, chicks, guinea pigs, sheep, hamsters, ducks, goslings and
  geese, bunnies and more. This was a great success.

**Green Schools Committee:** The Green Schools committee has the following suggestions for ways in which we can reduce our use of plastic in the next school year:

- Stainless steel lunchboxes are a durable and long lasting alternative to plastic one and are worth the initial cost
- Beeswax food wraps are a reusable alternative to cling film. Paper food wraps are also a better option than cling film.

**Parent Volunteer**: sincere thanks to Jennifer and Hilda for assisting us in sorting and storing our curriculum resources.

**School Booklists:** our booklists are available on the school website. We have greatly reduced our booklists for the next school year: only childrens workbooks will be purchased by parents.

The additional books that are removed from the booklist this year are: **Mathemagic, My English Read at Home, and Abair Liom.** If you could donate these books to the school, it would be of great assistance to our Book Rental programme.

We also plan to purchase over €8,000 worth of books to support the Primary Language Curriculum.

Our Book Rental fee per child is €25: payment may be made using Aladdin Connect.

**Education Passport:** 6<sup>th</sup> class pupils and their parents have completed the education passport documents, which have been sent to the secondary schools along with the 6<sup>th</sup> class school report.

Intel Grant expenditure: Maynooth Educate Together NS is delighted to be among the 2021 "Intel Pride of Place Competition" winners. The award comes just two months after the completion of phase 2 of our new school building so we now have the space to develop our new "Inspiration Zone" project. The project which will be partly funded by the 2021 Intel Pride of Place Competition EUR 5,000 award will be based in the space provided for the school library. The concept of a space in the school to focus on providing learning opportunities outside of the classroom was conceived as part of the new school building a number of years ago. The project will be delivered in the coming months with the support of the Intel award which is sooner than would have been previously possible.

The "Inspiration Zone" will provide learning tools that will encourage our children to develop their skills in the STEM subjects but will also support language and reading development. Since opening Maynooth Educate Together has supported our children's participation in science and maths projects and the new learning space will support further learning opportunities in these subjects. The space will also be used to advance learning in other subjects of interest and further support our children's educational development.

Maynooth Educate Together NS has grown from fourteen children when we opened in 2008 to over three hundred and seventy children in 2021. The school is a two-stream school with three special education classes. Educate Together is an established part of the local community in Maynooth and participates in relevant local community activities and as we develop we see our school as an important local resource.

**Crazy Hair Day:** in aid of Barrettstown was held in the school on Friday. What fun the pupils had with their mad mad hairstyles! Some photos will be posted on the school website in the coming days.

**Active Week:** June 14 -18. From Monday to Friday, all classes were scheduled to take part in a number of sporting activities which included races, handball, basketball, cycling, uni-hoc, football, Relays, and egg and spoon races. The weather was smashing, and each class was able to enjoy their sports outdoors throughout the week. Great fun was had by all.

**July Summer Programme:** ASD: the pupils in our ASD classes will take part in a 2-week July education programme. The programme will cater for our pupils and will be staffed by our teachers and SNA staff.
