Ongoing School Management of COVID-19

The following sets out the current COVID-19 management requirements on our return to school:

The Government has accepted the recommendations of the NPHET to remove remaining restrictions relating to mask-wearing and physical distancing in schools.

Therefore, pupils from 3rd class to 6th class are no longer required to wear face masks whilst indoors in school.

If members of staff or students wish to continue wearing face masks or coverings, they may do so.

School will continue to make masks available on request as they are currently doing.

- Continued use of good infection prevention and control measures such as handwashing, respiratory hygiene, and ventilation is advised.
- Critical components of the collective response in relation to COVID-19 continue to apply including selfisolation if symptomatic (even if fully vaccinated/boosted) or if having a positive COVID-19 test.
- Students and staff: staying at home if you have symptoms remains a requirement.
- School transport and Face coverings/mask wearing;
 with effect from Monday 28 February the wearing of face coverings/masks on school transport will no longer be mandatory but will continue to be advised.
- Cleaning and Hygiene in schools: Enhanced cleaning required to minimise the risks of COVID-19 will continue.

- As the general requirement for physical distancing in society no longer applies, schools are no longer required to maintain class pods and bubbles.
- Antigen testing arrangements for children in primary schools and special classes and special schools): As part of the transition arrangements the HSE will continue with the current processes to support the provision of antigen tests to primary schools, special schools and childcare settings.
- The Antigen Free phone number is: 1800 110055 or parents may order antigen tests online via www.hse.ie/schooltest. The call centre opening hours will be altered slightly and from next week onwards will be 8:45am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday (excluding bank holidays).

5th and 6th class trip: On Thursday the 24th of March, 5th and 6th class will travel to Dublin Castle. While at Dublin Castle the classes will partake in a guided tour of the Castle and learn about its history and the history of Dublin city. They will travel to the castle by bus leaving the school at approximately 9.30 am and will return at 2.10pm, depending on traffic.
