<u>Basketball Ireland Initiative</u>: Maynooth ETNS was one of very few schools across Ireland who was selected to participate in a basketball programme run by Basketball Ireland. The aim of the programme was to promote the sport of basketball in a fun, noncompetitive way.

As part of the programme skilled coaches visited the school on Fridays to run coaching sessions with the children in 4th and 5th class. The children got the chance to learn new skills and they put

these to the test when Scoil Choca Naofa visited our school for a mini blitz.

As well as that, 15 very lucky children from the school were selected to represent Maynooth ETNS in the National Basketball Arena in Tallaght on May 24th under the team name of the Detroit Pistons.

All in all, it was an excellent programme run by Basketball Ireland in conjunction with Junior NBA that was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone involved. They also very kindly gifted the school with a full set of basketball gear and an indoor leather basketball.

<u>Standardised Testing:</u> In line with the Department of Education regulations, the standardised test results from 2nd, 4th and 6th classes have been submitted to the Department.

<u>New Parents/Pupil School Visit</u>: Our annual visit of new parents and new pupils has taken place. We look forward to meeting you all again in September.

<u>School Booklists</u>: Our booklists will be available on the school website at the end of the school year. As it is now our practice, the majority of school books are provided to children under the book rental scheme. Closure of ASD Class: In the next school year, we will close our 3rd ASD Class due to a lack of a third ASD specific classroom. Our remaining 2 classes are fully enrolled. They will be allocated 1 Teacher and 2 Special Needs Assistants per class.

NCSE Allocation: At mainstream level, our SNA allocation remains unchanged from last year.

<u>Sixth Class Graduation</u>: Our 6th class graduation ceremony will take place in our school hall on Monday, 27th June at 8pm. This is a very special occasion for our 6th class boys and girls who put great work into making this a memorable occasion. The families of all 6th class pupils are invited. <u>New Permanent Teacher</u>: Due to our growing numbers, we have been granted an additional teacher for the next school year, under the Developing School Status system. The additional teacher will be used to create a second 6th class.

<u>Pat Cannon's Retirement</u>: At the end of this school year, Pat, our Special Needs Assistant, will retire. This retirement is a first for our school and it is with a heavy heart that we bid farewell to Pat. In 2008, in our first weeks, we applied to the Department of

Education and Skills for a Special Needs Assistant. Pat was appointed. As our most senior SNA, Pat has mentored all subsequent Special Needs Assistants and he set a very high bar. His care for, empathy with and interest in our pupils, permeates his work which he conducts with professionalism and expertise. Pat, quite literally became a corner-stone of our building. He has a remarkable range of talents. He is an IT expert, an electrician, a plumber, a carpenter, amongst others. All of these talents he has used in the school across its entire growth from 17 pupils in 2008 to over 350 pupils now. But without doubt, Pat's most endearing and valuable assets are his personal attributes. He is kind, caring, unassuming, quick-witted and oh so funny! He brings laughter and fun to all occasions and creates a warm and happy work environment.

We thank Pat for his huge contribution to our school. We wish him health and happiness in his retirement.
