

## A message from the HSE Oral Health Promotion Team

As part of the HSE Oral Health programme, we would like to take this opportunity to share information on Dental Health. It is vitally important that you continue to look after your child's oral health by maintaining a healthy diet and implementing an effective oral hygiene routine. We would like to take this opportunity to offer some diet and dental health advice for the following primary school age groups; 4 - 7 years and 8 - 13 years. Children with additional needs often have an increased risk of dental disease. We would like to take this opportunity to reinforce some diet and dental health advice for these children also. Children with additional needs often have an increased risk of dental disease and we would like to take this opportunity to reinforce some diet and dental health advice.

- Brush your child's teeth twice a day with fluoride toothpaste. Do not rinse away the toothpaste after brushing. Try to get your child to spit the toothpaste out.
- Reduce the amount and frequency of sugar. Unflavoured milk and water are the only tooth friendly drinks.
- Limit sugars to mealtimes and try to make snacks between meals sugar free.
