#### **School News**

**Cake sale:** Well done to Aimee, her class and the student council who raised €984 in our Valentine's Cake Sale. All funds will go towards the development of an outdoor classroom.

Parent/guardian survey: Thank you to everyone who completed our extra-curricular activity survey. Hearing your voice is very important to us. Here is a summary of the main findings.
Q1. In-school extra activities-too little 36.6% Acceptable Amount 63%
Q2. Fundraising and notice given- Yes acceptable notice 94% Not acceptable 6%
Q3. School tour graduated approach to venue/cost/notice given- Acceptable 100%
Q4. Use of more local venues/trips via public transport if appropriate- Acceptable 96% No 4%
Q5. Swimming- an important part of my child's school experience- Yes 92% No 8%
Q6 Which class (3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>) would benefit most from swimming- 3<sup>rd</sup> - 34% 4<sup>th</sup>- 28% 5<sup>th</sup>- 21% 6<sup>th</sup>-18%
Q7. My child enjoyed swimming- Yes 87% No 13%
Q8. The amount of time spent swimming was acceptable Yes- 78% No- 18%
Q9. Cost of Swimming- Acceptable and happy to pay more if required Yes- 87% No- 13%
