And of course they taste good too! So here are some sweets to add to your Halloween bucket...

It also has **LOADS** of popular flavours such as strawberry, orange, lemon, lime and blackcurrant. in mini sizes, and flavours like Double Deckers, Twirls, Flakes, Fudges, Dairy Milk, Mars, Milky Ways, Snickers, Twix and more cover the shop aisles.

4. Chupa Chups are lollipops that come in a range of different flavours such as Strawberries & Cream, Apple, Cola, Cherry and Orange. They are basically a hard-boiled sweet on a stick! What more could you want!? They are crunchy, sweet, flavoursome, tangy, fruity, sugary and more.
5. Dib Daps and Refreshers are old school favourites coming back into style! Refreshers are sticky, chewy sour little strips and Dib Daps are pockets of acidic sherbet and a candy stick to dip n dab! Pair them together for a taste sensation! The sherbet coats the sticky outcome of the Refresher, and it tastes SO GOOD! You could give these two sweets out individually or put them in little bags together for a cool combo!
6. Banshee Bones are a real Irish Halloween favourite. These chunky salt n vinegar puffs are a delight to eat, and they are in the shape of bones! They are a cross between Chickatees and Salt and Vinegar Taytos and have a banshee on the crisp bag, so perfect for the occasion.

7. Haribo Mini Multipack Jellies are probably the most popular and handy jellies in Ireland. They have Halloween themed jellies and sour, milky, vegan and more flavours! These are super cheap, and you can get them in 22 bag multipacks, and you can find them in Aldi, Tesco, Dunnes, Lidl, SPAR and more! And as they say" kids and adults love it so, the happy world of Haribo".

8. **Chocolate Pumpkins and Eyeballs** are chocolate shaped balls with eyeball and pumpkin wrappers, filled with vanilla creme. Nothing fancy here, just an easy option! Look out for the net bags in Flying Tiger or your local shop. Prices vary, but please try and shop local to support local business!

9. **Popping Candy** is a rare treat for a lot of kids, and we kids usually like to stockpile them up for Halloween. These come in mini bags, are cheap, not too sugary and come in flavours kids love.

IRISH HALLOWEEN TRADITIONS, ACTIVITIES AND CULTURES

Children dressed up in spooky scary costumes to scare off evil spirits while adults lit candles and gave out fruit and monkey nuts. I have even heard that in a little village in Kilkenny called Clogh, in the 1980s all the kids dressed up in black bin bags as their costumes. IRISH HALLOWEEN TRADITIONS

Bonfires are big fires that are usually lit in the middle of towns. People sometimes throw in offerings such as paper, rubbish and anything really as long as its not flammable, you don't want to cause a spreading fire! A bonfire is a big fire where you burn stuff as part of a celebration.

SPOOKY HALLOWEEN BROWNIES

Ingredients

200g butter

200g dark chocolate, roughly chopped

4 large eggs

350g caster sugar

100g plain flour

50g cocoa powder

100g milk chocolate, chopped

100g white chocolate chopped

12 Oreos

12 sugar-coated chocolates

red and black icing pens

Method

Heat the oven to 160C fan and line a 24 x 20cm brownie tin with baking parchment. Melt the butter and dark chocolate in a heatproof bowl set over a small pan of just simmering water.

Stir until completely smooth, then leave to cool for 10 mins.

Beat the eggs and sugar with an electric whisk until thick and pale – the mixture should double in volume and leave a trail when the beaters are lifted. Pour the cooled dark chocolate mixture around the edge of the bowl. Sift over the flour and cocoa, add the milk chocolate, and gently fold everything together with a spatula or large metal spoon. Pour into the prepared tin and bake for 35-40 mins. Meanwhile, make the 'eyeballs'. Melt the white chocolate in a heatproof bowl over the pan of just simmering water.

Stir until smooth. Dip each Oreo into the chocolate to cover one side.

Stick a chocolate in the centre of each, then leave to set. When the chocolate is fully dry, pipe a pupil and red veins onto each eyeball using the icing pens. Remove the traybake from the oven, and immediately



push the eyeballs into the surface in even rows – do this gently, so they're just pushed in slightly. Leave to cool completely. Cut into 12 squares.
